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## **PAUL WILSON**

### **What qualifications, knowledge and experience skills do you bring to the Board?**

I spent 23 years with the ADF starting in the Navy for 7 years before moving to the RAAF training and working as an Airframe Fitter. I retired in December 1993 as a Flight Sergeant in charge of a section of 41 troops at 77Sqn. I then designed and project managed the building of my own home in Raymond Terrace. After this I worked as a Maintenance Analysis writing maintenance schedules for naval ships, passenger ferries, trains, RAAF aircraft and some mining equipment.
